Kelsey Lizotte (Ph.D. Candidate, Rutgers University) is currently a lecturer in the Graduate ELL & ITA Program. Previously, she taught courses in the Department of Political Science at Rutgers-Newark and has worked as a writing tutor with students of various majors and backgrounds, including English Language Learners. She holds an M.S. from Rutgers' Division of Global Affairs and a B.S. in Criminal Justice, with a minor in Africana and Latino Studies, from the State University of New York.

Kelsey's dissertation proposes a structural and participatory approach for conceptualizing the theory and practice of race-based reparation politics. Her broader research examines issues of inequality through an interdisciplinary human rights lens--drawing on perspectives from sociology, history, political science and public policy.

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
