

FINANCIAL GUARANTEE FORM 2019-2020

- US Immigration regulations require that all F-1 students provide proof that they have adequate financial support to cover all estimated tuition and living expenses for study to be eligible for a Form I-20, Certificate of Eligibility for F-1 Status.
- All applicants requiring Form I-20 must provide proof of the following amount of money, depending on the anticipated length of stay. Form I-20 will be issued for either 6 or 12 months.
- Pursuant to US Immigration regulations, financial documents must be **original**. PALS cannot accept copies, faxes or emailed documents. Mail original financial documents to the PALS office at the address indicated above.
